## **Programs and Fellowship Opportunities**

<u>Music Ministry</u>-The goal of the music ministry at Caledonia United Methodist Church is to inspire a faith-filled community at worship as we pray, ring and sing with the talents God has given to us.

We are blessed with a three octave <u>Bell</u> set and a 2 octave <u>Hand Chime</u> set. The bell choir rings both of these instruments when needed. We meet at 6pm-7pm Tuesdays September through May. Being able to read music is not required but helpful. The Bell choir usually rings at worship once a month and special holidays.

The <u>Chancel Choir</u> meets at 7pm-8pm on Tuesdays and usually sings weekly September through May, with occasional Sundays "off". One highlight of the Chancel Choir is our Christmas Cantata presented during the worship service one Sunday in December. Easter Sunday is another time the Bell Choir and Chancel Choirs share their gifts.

The <u>Ensemble</u> participates in worship 3-4 times per calendar year and provides a contemporary sound to our worshipping community. If you play an instrument or enjoy solo work, this group would be for you.

Summer Worship consists of volunteer musicians who provide special music while the choirs are in summer recess.

## **Our Church History**

- 1875 David Kinsey deeded land in Caledonia, at the corner of Church and Main Streets, to the Methodist Episcopal Church. The Methodists purchased and relocated the old Caledonia school building to this property to be their first church.
- 1896 This first building was moved to Mill Street and became the property of the village of Caledonia. It still stands as storage. A new church was constructed on the Kinsey property at the corner of Church and Main Streets.
- 1900 On New Year's Eve, a mortgage burning ceremony was held for the new building on the Kinsey property. This building was in continuous use until 1963.
- 1960 Land for a new church was purchased on Vine Street in Caledonia.
- 1962 September 16, groundbreaking ceremonies for a new church were held. Construction began immediately.
- 1963 Easter Sunday, April 14, the first service was held in the Vine Street church. The cost of the building was \$69,111, with a great deal of work being done by the members themselves.
- 1970 In November, a mortgage burning ceremony was held for the Vine Street Church. This same building is our church home today.
- 1980 Plans were drawn up for the construction of a new parsonage at 260 Vine Street, property owned by the church and adjacent to the existing church building.
- 1981, the house was completed; and the pastor and family moved into the new and spacious four-bedroom house, which still serves as home to the church's pastors and families.
- 2005 After just three years, a new building site on Kraft Avenue was paid off; and once again, the church is looking to expand with bricks and mortar, with program, and with the love of Christ.
- 2011 The church installed new boilers
- 2013 New windows were added to the office and classrooms, Sanctuary chairs and pew cushions were added.
- 2014 New roof and windows in the Fellowship Hall and Entry
- 2015 The parsonage had a new boiler installed
- 2016 Technology was updated for the sound booth, Sanctuary storm windows were installed, a new well was dug and the parking lots were repaved.
