I feel like the month of July was filled with all things Caledonia Community Garden. Our interns, Meg and Carter, worked tirelessly to organize a You Pick! Day out at the Garden. It was a successful day, with 25 people stopping by in our three hour span. Then they led a worship service celebrating this ministry that Caledonia UMC offers to our community. It was a beautiful weekend of living into the ministry of the Garden.

When I first found out I was coming to pastor Caledonia UMC, I, like anybody would, Googled this church to get a sense of what to expect. When I read that about the Community Garden, I was excited. When I came in May of 2019 to co-lead worship with Jodie, I made a stop by the Community Garden and was, honestly, surprised at how big it was. See, when I read about the Garden, I was picturing a few beds of some basic vegetables, like tomatoes and lettuce. But to see the Garden (which really strikes me as more like a small farm) in person was awe inspiring. "Wow," I thought, "What a great resource for this community. What a beautiful ministry opportunity this church has. I can't wait to work with it."

It's funny, I'm not much of a gardener myself. Just look at the sad excuse for a garden outside the parsonage for proof. But what I am all for is new ways of doing ministry, particularly as we move into the 21st century. Church looks different, and it has looked different, even before we moved into a pandemic time. Many mourn the loss of the time when church was an expectation. When you'd walk out the door, dressed in your best, and wave to your neighbors who were also dressed in their best. When pews were filled and you could hear the cries of babies and laughter of children. That's not our reality anymore. And if we try to do ministry in a way that fits that reality? We're only going to end up disappointed.

So, church has to adapt. Ministry has to change. And here at Caledonia UMC we have a way of doing ministry that is *different* than any other church in the area. That's the Garden.

I have found that the Garden has brought me hope in these pandemic days. When we are unable to meet indoors, we can come together to plant seeds and vegetables. When we can't gather around a table, we can gather around a garden bed. When we can't take communion together, we can pluck carrots and beets and radishes up from the ground and use them to nourish our bodies. The very fact that we have a space where we can be with Creation, tending to the Earth, interacting with God is so amazing. The fact that we can share this space with our community is also amazing. It is a way to reach new people that we should be excited to live into.

Tuesday July 14th, Meg and Carter picked some of the extra veggies from the Garden to donate to the food pantry at Holy Family! Not only were we able to connect community members to the Garden, but we were able to donate fresh veggies to those in need!



At the end of the month, we'll be changing over the wood beds to cinderblock beds, for more permanent beds at the Garden. The cost of the bricks is \$360. If you would like to help with the cost of bricks, or any of the other projects at the Garden, you can give money to the Community Garden Designated Fund.

The Trustees have been discussing resealing the parking lot. At their July meeting. they approved giving the job to Parking Lot Maintenance in Dutton. Gordon Giar has known them for years and they come highly recommended. We also reviewed one other job offer. Cost estimate is just under \$4200. The company is prepping this week (July 20) and hope to have it completed by the end of the week. Next time you are in the village stop by and look at the new parking lot.
