

We're facing tough and unknown times. But we're not facing them alone. We have this family behind us. Thanks be to God.



Dear UMW Members,



they get at navigation. This also improves your map-reading skills. Orienteering courses have numbered orange and white flags placed in the terrain and the maps use symbols, like a triangle, circle and lines.




We will read and discuss The Starless Sea by Erin Morgenstern.
